#### From Dwayne (Yanhao) Li on the Winter Youth Olympic Games and Junior World Champs

The experience of the Youth Olympic Games was a remarkable and emotional journey. Skating in such a vast venue was both exciting and nerve-racking, but it was also incredibly rewarding. The training leading up to the games was tiring and lengthy; however, the results at the end made the intense training worthwhile. The Olympic environment was something very special, and it is something I am eagerly anticipating as I aim for the 2030 Games. Transitioning from the Youth Olympics to Junior Worlds, which were just around the corner, was tough and challenging. It required precise planning, efficient recovery, and focus despite the attention and expectations.

As Junior Worlds marked the last event of the season for me, it became a test of perseverance and alertness. While the short program was not my initial goal, I managed to keep a clear mind for the free skate. I was able to deliver a desirable performance in the free skate and end this season on a high note. The physical and emotional pressure of competing at two significant events back-to-back cannot be overstated. However, it was also an invaluable opportunity for growth

and learning. Overcoming the fatigue and performing at my best required determination at a new level.

Overall, the YOG and Junior World experience was hard to come by, and I am glad that I made the most of these opportunities. I feel proud to represent New Zealand at such a high level, and I am committed to unlocking my full potential.

#### From Megan Briggs on the recent Black Ice overseas interclub experience

To start 2024, Black Ice were given the incredible opportunity to compete in the two overseas Synchro Inter Club Competitions, Trophy D'Ecosse in Dumfries, Scotland and Hevelius Cup in Gdańsk, Poland. Black Ice could not have been prouder to be competing overseas and as a team

we faced these two competitions head on and in full confidence we could do our club and our country proud. Our hard work over the summer holidays that included hours and hours of hard training and team bonding, could not have paid off more! We were so happy to be able to bring home not one but two shiny bronze medals! Having the opportunity to meet some of the teams from different parts of the world and also being able to observe some of the top teams compete has definitely been a highlight. For me especially, it has changed the way that I see synchro as a sport, as well as being an experience for me to reflect on the type of skater that I want to be in the near future.



Over the 3-week duration of our trip, as a team we were able to manage a good amount of sight seeing, therefore balancing out our skating time. Starting off our trip with an extraordinary desert safari and camel riding in Dubai. Another big highlight for me would have definitely been our 3-day Edinburgh trip after Trophy d'Ecosse, which came as a great opportunity for us to celebrate our success and see some of Scotland together. This came as a great team bonding experience before we headed off to compete in Gdańsk. As a team we were able to explore a bit of Poland before we competed a second time around. We were lucky enough that some of Team Ice Fires skaters were happy to take us around the old town, giving us a great taste of the polish culture and the gorgeous historical buildings they have there. Overall, this was probably the best

experience Black Ice has had together as a team and together we have made some of the most unforgettable memories. I think this trip has definitely only made us stronger and as a team we are more than ready to take on the 2024 season. Moving forward, I am more than confident that great things are ahead for us.

After years of blood, sweat and tears, our team, Black Ice, had the opportunity to skate at interclub competitions in Europe and were overjoyed that our dream would become a reality. On the way to Europe we spent a few days in Dubai camel riding, admiring the lights and fountain show

in front of the Burj Khalifa, and skating at the ice rink inside the Dubai Mall. In Scotland, we reunited with our former teammates Sabrina Snoad and Afton Sperry, who would be skating with us in Europe. Competition day at Trophy d'Ecosse in Dumfries was a very exciting day with us earning our first bronze medal and attending the Ceilidh ceremony, where we were able to dance and interact with other teams over dinner. We also explored Edinburgh, admiring the stunning architecture of the buildings lining the intricate cobblestone-paved streets and visiting castles with rich histories.



In Poland, we were lucky to have been given a tour of the Gdansk Old Town by two lovely local skaters who were also competing in Mixed Age. At the Hevelius Cup, we were able to watch some incredible, well-known teams perform including Nexxice, Team Marigold, Team Miami University and the Haydenettes. This was another dream come true for me. We made ourselves and loved ones proud by coming third out of nine teams, and gaining 3 more points than we did in Scotland! From Gdansk, we spent a few days in Warsaw wandering through the Old Town, shopping and skating at an outdoor ice rink before some of the team went on to travel elsewhere, and the rest of us began the journey home. It had been my goal to skate with Black Ice since I joined synchro in 2017, and to have been able to compete overseas with them was a dream come true. The team has so much love and passion for the sport, and coming home with not one but two bronze medals was an incredible result.

# CLUCAS CUP (SELECTION COMPETITION), DUNEDIN 15 & 16 JUNE 2024

In recognition of the contribution made to figure skating this competition is named after our late Patron, Wendy Clucas (nee Grafton).

The Clucas Cup will be awarded to the skater/ couple / or team that gains the highest percentage above the A team Selection TES, with the highest unfactored programme component score as the deciding factor if more than 1 skater is on a par.

As per the NZIFSA Selection Policy, this competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2024 and one week after our National Championships. The competition will be open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized skating, who competed at the 2023 National Championships and who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2024. # **UPCOMING SKATER DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES**

#### <u>Singles Basic Novice to Senior, Auckland (Botany), 29 March – 1 April</u>

Only two weeks to go before this workshop with Keegan Murphy as is the international moderator. Keegan represented Canada internationally on the Junior Grand Prix Circuit for 5 years and won the silver medal at the 2002 Canadian Championships in Junior Men. In his 10 years of coaching, Keegan has quickly produced a stable of provincial and national champions as well as international competitors on the Junior Grand Prix Circuit, ISU Junior World Championships and ISU Senior International Circuit.

Registrations for this camp closed **Tuesday 5 March**. A detailed schedule will be available soon, however we anticipate the camp will start around 7am on Friday 29 March and will finish around 1:30pm on Monday 1 April. Participants from outside Auckland should plan to stay in Auckland on the Thursday night before the camp starts.

#### Synchronized Skating, Dunedin 16 & 17 April and Auckland (Botany), 19-21 April

Heather Paige has confirmed her availability for these two workshops. These workshops are aimed at our Basic Novice to Senior Level teams. Heather was the coach that we engaged virtually in 2022 and in person in 2023. Heather is a Moderator/Mentor for the ISU SYS Technical Committee and Coach/Director of the Starlights SYS teams out of the Chicago area in the US.

The **KiwiSkate** courses are open to new KiwiSkate coaches as well as currently accredited coaches wishing to attain points to maintain their accreditation. The **course cost is \$80.** The courses cover two levels:

- KiwiSkate Assistant Course individuals must be 14 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and it is recommended they hold an Elementary test in any discipline.
- KiwiSkate Coach Course individuals must be 15 years of age as at 1 January prior to the course and must hold an Elementary test in any discipline. Coaches from different codes may apply to the Coaching Director for test dispensation based on their achievements/qualifications.
