ENTRIES:

- Entries shall be made by skaters on the official entry form and be received, with entry fee, by a designated Club Committee member on or before the above closing date.
- Kiwi Skate School entrants must have been enrolled in a Paradise skate school class in 2011 or 2012 (either rink), and have completed Novice 1 badge level. (Please see Notice to Skate School Pupils)
- All other entrants should hold a current NZISA Test and Competition (TC) Registration. TC application forms are available from the Secretary of your home club.

NOTE:

Entrants do not need to be financial members of AIFSC, however if a non-member wins a grade, then the trophy (if any) may not be awarded. (For membership to be counted the club membership fee must be paid by the date of the draw.)

CALCULATION OF RESULTS:

All grades will be judged under the new IJS system except for Kiwi Skate which will be judged under the ordinal system.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS AND NOTES:

- Refer to NZISA rules for programme and other requirements.
- Skaters must have passed the required test for the grade they are entering at the time their entry is submitted.
- Skaters taking and passing tests after their entry is submitted and before the draw who wish to skate up a grade must contact the competition organizer (info@aifsc.org.nz) no later than 12 hours prior to the draw to indicate this.
- **Current PPC's are required to validate your entry. Please ensure your PPC is updated on NZISA website at the time of entering the competition or your entry will be in-validated.** (<http://www.nzifsa.org.nz/members/mynzifsa/ppc.php>)
- All competitors shall provide music on **compact disc only** (coaches to provide Kiwi skate entrant's music). CDs must be presented in a case.
- Each CD must contain only one track and must be marked with competitors name, the grade/event, and the exact running time of the music.
- Please hand your music in to Penny O'Rorke or Bridget Danbrook as soon as possible after the draw.

SINGLES (NZISA KIWI SKATE PROGRAM Rule 702, 705, 707)

SINGLES (NZISA Rule 229.3)

Pre Elementary Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 15 sec
 - Skater may not hold any NZISA Free Skating medals
 - Skater **may hold** Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking test but no higher
- #### Elementary Ladies/Men
- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 15sec
 - Have passed a minimum of Test 0 (Elementary) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 0 (Elementary) Stroking

SINGLES (NZISA Rule 227.1, 229.1, 229.2)

Juvenile Ladies/Men U12

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 15 sec (± 10 sec)
- To have not reached the age of 12 before the 1st July preceding the competition
- Have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking

Juvenile Ladies/Men Over 12

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 15 sec (± 10 sec)
- To have reached the age of 12 but not 18 before the 1st July preceding the competition
- Have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking

Pre-Primary Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Stroking

Primary Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min (± 10 sec)
- To have not reached the age of 14 before the 1st July preceding the competition
- Have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Stroking

Intermediate Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min (± 10 sec)
- Have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Stroking

Novice Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme (ladies) - 3 min (± 10 sec)
- Free Skating Programme (men) - 3 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 30 sec
- Have passed a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Stroking or have passed the Novice Competitive test

Junior Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme (ladies) - 3 min 30 sec
- Free Skating Programme (men) - 4 min
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec
- Have passed a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Stroking or have passed the Junior Competitive test

Senior Ladies/Men

- Free Skating Programme (ladies) - 4 min
- Free Skating Programme (men) - 4 min 30 sec
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec
- Have passed a minimum of Test 6 (Inter Gold) Freeskating and a minimum of Test 6 (Inter Gold) Stroking or have passed the Senior Competitive test

NOTE:

For all grades, skaters must not have competed in a higher grade, either locally, nationally or internationally. The exception to this is the Junior Grade if the skater is eligible under Rule 228.

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PAIRS (NZISA Rule 227.3, 230.1, 230.2)

Elementary

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 15 sec (± 10 sec)
- Both skaters to have passed NO NZISA Pairs tests

Juvenile

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 15 sec (± 10 sec)
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking

Pre-Primary

- Free Skating Programme - 2 min 15 sec (± 10 sec)
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Stroking

Primary

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min (± 10 sec)
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Stroking

Novice

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Stroking or have passed the Pairs Novice Competitive test

Junior

- Free Skating Programme - 4 min (± 10 sec)
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Stroking or have passed the Pairs Junior Competitive test

Senior

- Free Skating Programme - 4 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec
- Couples to have passed a minimum of Test 6 (Inter Gold) Pairs Skating and a minimum of Test 6 (Inter Gold) Stroking or have passed the Pairs Senior Competitive test

NOTE:

- Only one partner may have competed in a grade higher than the one being entered. The exception to this is the Junior grade if the couple is eligible under Rule 228.1
- There are no age restrictions on the above pairs grades

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ICE DANCE (Includes Ice Dance for Couples and Solo Dance)

ICE DANCE (NZISA Rule 231.4)

Pre-Elementary

- Both skaters to have passed NO NZISA Dance tests

Elementary

- At least one skater must have passed Test 0 (Elementary) Pattern Dance test at the closing of entries and either or both skaters may hold higher.

ICE DANCE (NZISA Rule 227.5, 231.1, 231.2)

Juvenile

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Dance

Pre-Primary

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Dance

Primary

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Dance

Novice

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Dance with at least one skater holding a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Dance or have passed the Novice Competitive Dance test

Junior

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Dance with at least one skater holding a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Dance or have passed the Junior Competitive Dance test

Senior

- Both skaters must have passed a minimum of Test 5 (Silver) Dance with at least one skater holding a minimum of Test 6 (Inter Gold) Dance or have passed the Senior Competitive Dance test

NOTES FOR DANCE:

- The partnership must not have competed in a grade higher than the one being entered. The exception to this is the Junior grade if the couple is eligible under Rule 228.1
- Refer to NSIZA Rule 231.1 to identify which Pattern Dance to draw from.
- There are no age restrictions for the above dance grades

OPEN WALTZ

- Open to all dance couples
- European Waltz to be used

SOLO DANCE (NZISA 231.6)

Pre-Elementary

- Both skaters to have passed NO NZISA Dance tests

Elementary

- At least one skater must have passed Test 0 (Elementary) Pattern Dance test at the closing of entries and either or both skaters may hold higher.

SOLO DANCE (NZISA Rule 227.7, 231.5)

Juvenile

- Have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Dance and may hold higher

Pre-Primary

- Have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Dance and may hold higher

Primary

- Have passed a minimum of Test 3 (Bronze) Dance and may hold higher

Open

- Have passed a minimum of Test 4 (Inter Silver) Dance and may hold higher

NOTE:

- For all grades, skaters must not have competed in a higher grade, either locally, nationally or internationally.
- Refer to NSIZA Rule 231.5 to identify which Pattern Dance to draw from.

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ADULT SINGLES (NZISA Rule 227.2, 229.4, 229.5)

Entry into Adult Bronze, Silver, Gold and Elite level is self-selecting with no minimum test requirements. Refer to NZISA ruling for guidelines.

Bronze I

- Free Skating Programme – up to 1 min 50 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Bronze II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 1 min 50 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Bronze/Silver Interpretive

- Interpretive Programme - up to 1 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold/Elite Interpretive

- Interpretive Programme - up to 1 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

NOTE:

Men and Ladies will be judged separately.

ADULT PAIRS (NZISA Rule 227.4, 230.3)

Entry into Adult Bronze, Silver, Gold and Elite level is self-selecting with no minimum test requirements. Refer to NZISA ruling for guidelines.

In pair skating where couples bridge the age group, the elder skater of the partnership must skate in the younger age group.

Bronze I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Bronze II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 2 min 40 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite I

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite II

- Free Skating Programme - up to 3 min 10 sec
- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

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ADULT ICE DANCE (Includes Adult Ice Dance for Couples and Adult Solo Dance)

Entry into Adult Bronze, Silver, Gold and Elite level is self-selecting with no minimum test requirements. Refer to NZISA ruling for guidelines.

In Dance where couples bridge the age group, the elder skater of the partnership must skate in the younger age group.

ADULT ICE DANCE (NZISA Rule 227.6, 231.3)

Bronze I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Bronze II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

NOTE:

- Refer to NSIZA Rule 231.1 to identify which Pattern Dance to draw from.

ADULT SOLO DANCE (NZISA Rule 227.8, 231.7)

Bronze I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Bronze II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Silver II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Gold II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite I

- Reached the age of 18 but not reached the age of 35 years before the 1st July preceding the competition

Elite II

- Reached the age of 35 years or more before the 1st July preceding the competition

NOTE:

Refer to NSIZA Rule 231.7 to identify which Pattern Dance to draw from.

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SYNCHRONIZED SKATING (NZISA Rule 227.9, 603, 604, 605)

Juvenile

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min (± 10 sec)
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 0 (Elementary) Stroking or Test 0 (Elementary) Ice Dance

Open

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- No age limits
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking or Test 1 (Preliminary) Ice Dance

Novice

- Free Skating Programme - 3 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- At least 75% of the skaters must be aged 15 or under before the 1st July preceding the competition
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 1 (Preliminary) Stroking or Test 1 (Preliminary) Ice Dance

Junior

- Free Skating Programme - 4 min (± 10 sec)
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec, but may be less provided all elements have been included
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- At least 75% of the skaters must have reached the age of 12 but not have reached the age of 19 before the 1st July preceding the competition
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Stroking or Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Ice Dance

Senior

- Free Skating Programme - 4 min 30 sec (± 10 sec)
- Short Programme – must not exceed 2 min 50 sec, but may be less provided all elements have been included
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- At least 75% of the skaters must have reached the age of 14 before the 1st July preceding the competition
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Stroking or Test 2 (Inter Bronze) Ice Dance

Adult

- Free Skating Programme – minimum of 2 min 30 sec and maximum of 3 minutes 30 sec
- Team of 9 – 16 skaters
- Skaters must be 25 years of age or older before the 1st July preceding the competition
- 25% of the skaters may be less than 25 years but must be 18 years of age or older before the 1st July preceding the competition
- All skaters on the team must have passed a minimum of Test 0 (Elementary) Stroking or Test 0 (Elementary) Ice Dance

NOTE:

- Each team may have a maximum of four (4) alternates on the team roster and they must be listed as such
- Team numbers and age restrictions per Rule 227.9
- Eligibility per Rule 603
- Program requirements per Rule 604
