COMPETITIONS, TESTS AND THE UNCERTAINTY CREATED BY COVID-19

NZIFSA are planning to meet with club representatives next week to discuss the potential rescheduling of competitions. We will attempt to keep you advised of any changes to competition dates, though clearly it is early days in terms of managing this current outbreak. There is a high degree of uncertainty around when we might be back at Alert Level 1 and able to hold competitions and tests.

We include here the message that was sent out to members earlier this week.

The Board are aware of how difficult the current situation is for our skating community. We would like to remind you all of the stipulations that were put in place last year to ensure the safety of our events:

- For any region in Covid-19 Alert Level 2 or above, Club and Regional competitions and tests in that region cannot be held. NZIFSA will be working with local clubs to help reschedule any competitions if necessary.
- If any region in New Zealand is under Alert Level 2 or above at the commencement of the National Championships, the National Championships will not be held. We will be looking to reschedule if possible.
- For any region in Covid-19 Alert Level 1, competitions and tests can continue as planned, however skaters from a region that is in Alert Level 2 or above at the commencement of the competition/test may not attend and will be refunded any competition entry/test fees

The following competitions may need to be cancelled or rescheduled, depending on the outcome of future government announcements:

- Allegro Champs 28 August 29 August
- North Island Champs 4 September 5 September

We are hoping that the current situation in New Zealand does not impact the following competitions and will advise members of any updates as they come to fruition.

- Queenstown Ice Skating Club Champs 11 September
- CMFSC Club Championships 2 October 3 October
- National Championships 9 October 12 October

If our National Championships needs to be rescheduled, it will be done so in the same manner that it was last year. The process for this will be as follows:

- The new date for Nationals will be the final date.
- If one region of New Zealand goes into Level 2 or above at the commencement of Nationals, there will be no further postponement.

All entry fees paid will be refunded.

The Board are well aware of the disappointment that any postponements or cancellations may cause for skaters, coaches, officials, and families. We believe it is in the best interest of our skating community to keep as safe as we possibly can.

In the meantime, we are lucky to be able to communicate digitally. Coaches and skaters, please stay connected over this time to maintain off ice training and fitness, a positive mindset and skater and/or team morale.

SELECTION TO INTERNATIONAL A TEAM

We are very pleased to advise that Jojo Hong has gained the necessary Total Element Score (TES) at the Skate Wilmington competition on 13 -18 July to be named as an International A Team Representative in Senior Ladies, and because she is age eligible, to Junior Ladies.

This selection is as per the decision communicated in the June 2020 newsletter that recognised the challenges our skaters that live and train overseas faced, with regards to selection and the ability to compete at the 2020 Nationals. The Board had agreed that, in the event that these skaters were unable to attend the 2020 New Zealand Ice Figure Skating Championships, either due to travel restrictions or the 14 day quarantine requirement being in place, that they be given the opportunity to be selected to the respective grade for International selection and Australian Nationals. Selection would be subject to evidence of attaining the TES for the International A or B team, or Australian Nationals, as



applicable. This evidence could be competition results or a pre-approved monitoring session.

ISU 2021 COACH SCHOLARSHIP ICE DANCE FOR DEBBIE DARVILL

Congratulations to Debbie Darvill who has been selected by the ISU Ice Dance Technical Committee and the ISU Development Commission to continue to be part of their coach mentoring programme. This scholarship provides Debbie with mentoring from international experts for a further period from September 1, 2021 to February 28, 2022, with a mix of group sessions and one-to-one interaction. This is a well-deserved recognition from the ISU.

ANTI-DOPING SEMINARS

To this end we expect all skaters who are Advanced Novice level and up who compete at our 2021 Nationals, and any Basic or Intermediate Novice level skaters who might be considering competing internationally if the opportunity arises, to attend an anti-doping seminar. Anyone competing internationally must attend anti-doping training. Please pencil in 2pm on Tuesday 12 October for this seminar. This is at the end of our National Championships. We will confirm this date and time and the location closer to the time.

LAST CHANCE - NOMINATIONS FOR ADMINISTRATOR OF THE YEAR AND SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR AWARDS ARE DUE BY 1 SEPTEMBER

Criteria for the Administrator of the Year Award

- Take on a leadership or integral role in their club / sub-association
- Take on administrative/organisational roles and perform their duties in a manner that progresses the sport or enhances the functioning of the club / sub-association
- Positive role model for other administrators of our sport
- Possibly work in a mentoring role within the club / sub-association

Criteria for Nomination for Sportsperson of the Year Award

- Positive role model for other skaters
- Demonstrate a 'fair play' attitude/good sportspersonship
- Positive and tangible contribution to their club and the sport in general
- Active role in the activities offered by the club and/or skate school, e.g. club nights, fundraising, KiwiSkate coaching sessions, etc.

NOTE: While skating achievement is considered, it is not the basis of this award
