### RECENT SKATER DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

## A & B Team Technical Feedback Session, Auckland (Botany), 9 May

In conjunction with our officials' training, NZIFSA ran a technical feedback session for our A and B Team skaters (total 8 skaters) with international technical panelists: ISU Referee & Technical Controller Rob Rosenbluth and ISU Judge/International Technical Controller Steven Hsu, both from the USA.

The on-ice feedback sessions were particularly productive, and the athletes who attended truly appreciated the insights shared.

## Technical Rules Session (for everyone), Auckland/Zoom, 9 May

A free technical rules session with our international moderators was held on Friday 9 May. This session was aimed at skaters at Juvenile level and above, all coaches, and all officials. Attendance at the technical rule session was disappointingly low despite being held over Zoom. It's unfortunate that more skaters were unable to take part in such a rare and valuable opportunity for direct technical input. While we understand that travel costs can be a factor and that a Friday afternoon may not be ideal, the lack of engagement in an online session suggests the issue goes

beyond scheduling and highlights a potential disconnect in recognizing the importance of technical education.

## **CLUCAS CUP (SELECTION COMPETITION), AUCKLAND 13 & 14 JUNE 2025**

In recognition of the contribution made to figure skating this competition is named after our late Patron, Wendy Clucas (nee Grafton).

The Clucas Cup will be awarded to the skater/ couple / or team that gains the highest percentage above the A team Selection TES, with the highest unfactored programme component score as the deciding factor if more than 1 skater is on a par.

As per the NZIFSA Selection Policy, this competition is to determine selection and priority order for international competitions with a closing date between 7 July 2025 and one week after our National Championships. The competition is open to skaters in Basic Novice to Senior grades in all disciplines, plus Mixed Age Synchronized skating, who competed at the 2024 National Championships and who are age eligible for international competition in their respective grade as at 1 July 2025. Entries for this competition have already closed.

Note, the technical requirements for this event are as per the ISU Regulations and relevant ISU Communications for the 2024/25 season.

### JUNIOR GRAND PRIX ALLOCATIONS

The ISU have advised which Junior Grand Prix competitions we have been allocated for the 2025/26 season:

1<sup>st</sup> event Riga / Latvia, 20-23 August Men

2nd event Ankara /Turkey, 27-30 AugustMen, Women3rd event Varese / Italy, 3-6 SeptemberMen, Women4th event Bangkok / Thailand, 9-13 SeptemberMen, Women

5<sup>th</sup> event Baku / Azerbaijan, 24-27th September Men 6<sup>th</sup> event Gdansk / Poland, 1-4 October Men

Dwayne Li has his choice of two of the six events we have been allocated for Men. The priority for the Women's places will be determined after the Clucas Cup.

### CALL FOR TEAM LEADERS FOR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

The NZIFSA are seeking expressions of interest from suitably experienced individuals to fulfil the Team Leader role at the following International Competitions-:

- Asian Open Figure Skating Trophy Manila, Philippines, 1-4 August (TBC)
- Cranberry Cup International Boston, USA, 7-10 August
- Junior Grand Prix Ankara, Turkey, 27-30 August
- Junior Grand Prix Varese, Italy, 3-6 September
- Junior Grand Prix Bangkok, Thailand, 9-13 September

For all events with 2 or more skaters a skater's coach or parent will not normally be named as Team Leader.

We are looking for team leaders who have enough experience of international competitions, ideally either as an official or coach, to be able to coordinate the activities of our team members. As outlined in the position description, they need to be able to handle crisis situations as well as routine administrative tasks; be team players who can work with all athletes, coaches, judges, parents, and administrators; have knowledge of the NZIFSA rules and agreements surrounding international participation; and, have local knowledge that well assist them in carrying out their role.

The NZIFSA Funding Policy <a href="https://nzifsa.org.nz/rules/Funding%20Policy%20%20V11.pdf">https://nzifsa.org.nz/rules/Funding%20Policy%20%20V11.pdf</a> section 10, outlines two different maximum funding criteria based on the location of each ISU Championship or International as indicated below:

- For events in North/South America, Asia and Oceania, \$1,650 plus cost of official accommodation if not provided by ISU for official days of competition
- For events in Europe and South Africa, \$2,750 plus cost of official accommodation if not provided by ISU for official days of competition

Normally a person may be selected for a team leader position only once per funding season, however if circumstances require an individual to serve as team leader at more than one competition, funding will be provided in all cases.

## **FURTHER CALL FOR EOI FOR CEO & ANTI-DOPING OFFICER ROLES**

Unfortunately, we didn't receive any expressions of interest in either the CEO or the Anti-Doping Officer roles. The NZIFSA Board are therefore putting out a further call seeking expressions of interest to fill the following two roles:

- **CEO** for a one year term (until the 2026 AGM)
- Anti-Doping Officer for a two year term (until the 2027 AGM)

If the Board are unable to find a suitable candidate for the CEO role, as a last resort the current Secretary will consider stepping down from the Secretary role to accept an appointment as CEO role until the next AGM. With this in mind, the Board are also seeking expressions of interest in the **Secretary** role to back fill that role if needed.

## MUSIC DETAILS REQUIRED FOR MUSIC LICENSING

In preparation for the 2025 competition season we need everyone to provide or update your music details to help ensure we can meet our music licensing requirements.

For all club and regional competitions in the South Island and for the Clucas Cup and our National Championships, please use the NZIFSA form.

**NOTE:** The North Island Ice Skating Sub Association (NIISSA) has chosen to manage the music information using a separate system for North Island club and regional competitions that better meets their needs.

### What information do you need to provide?

#### 1 General

Skater name(s), email address(s), grade, coach name, coach email address. Please update coach contact details if this has changed.

Note, only one form needs to be completed for ice dance couples and pairs teams. For synchro teams we ask for the team manager and coach contact details.

### 2 What competitions and grade are you entering?

Please mark which competitions you are entering and pick the correct grade from the drop down menu. This helps the competition organisers when checking that they have your music details. You can come back and update this again later with any additional competitions you enter, or if you move up grades during the year.

#### 3 The music details.

For each programme you skate you will need to provide the following for each piece of music used

- Title of Music
- Recording Artist(s)
- Composer(s)
- Publisher / Record Label
- Duration of cut (min:sec e.g. 1:40)
- Whether vocal or non-vocal (instrumental)

We suggest you collect this information for each piece music before you start filling in the form. If you are trying to find the details, we recommend you find your piece of music in Spotify, click on the 3 dots ... for extra information and choose "Show credits".

### Saving and updating the form

You need to click the save button at the bottom right of the form before you exit. The skater and coach will both be sent an email called "2025 Music details Save & Resume Link". With this link you will be able to go back and update details, including entry to additional competitions or changes to the music details recorded.

### Separate forms for different events

If a skater is competing more than one event, e.g. Dance and Singles, or Interpretive and Singles, then separate forms need to be completed. This is so that we can check that we have the required music details for any given competition. But if you compete in an event that has more than one part to it - e.g. a Short Programme and a Freeskate, you can enter this information in the one form.
